Rare Diseases

The UKKA rare diseases group and RaDaR database offer opportunities, particularly for those interested in orphan drugs used in renal medicine.

This could be the scoping of clinical trials or the potential for improvement in the identification of people with rare diseases and their inclusion in the RaDaR database.

It is also where the specialist audit and the data collection of the UK Renal Registry could augment a clinical trial programme for safety and efficacy (for registration) and post-marketing surveillance.

eLearning

eLearning packages on the Moodle education platform on the UKKA website can be developed collaboratively to assist in the training and engagement of clinical staff. They can be accessed by UKKA members at no additional cost and sign-posted as part of our eBulletins in UKKA newsletters.
